### A

The Cuckoo's Calling, a detective novel published in London in the spring of 2013, was not a huge commercial success. But the novel, by a "former military police investigator" writing under the pen name Robert Galbraith, got great reviews. Readers described it as complex and impressively clever. They said the book seemed almost too sophisticated（老练的）to be a first novel.

And they were right. The book turned out to have been written not by an ex-military officer, or even by a man. Instead, J.K. Rowling was unmasked by *The Sunday Times of London* as the author of *The Cuckoo's Calling*.

The story of how the truth was uncovered started from a tweet from an anonymous（匿名的）person, said Richard Brooks, the newspaper's arts editor. Mr. Brooks described to investigate secretly.

First he did some Internet detective work, finding many similarities between *The Cuckoo's Calling* and *The Casual Vacancy*, Ms. Rowling's first novel for adults. The books shared the same agent, publisher and editor in Britain. It seemed particularly strange, he said, that the editor would be in charge of both someone as important as J.K. Rowling and someone as unheard-of as Robert Galbraith.

He then sent copies of the two books and the last Harry Potter novel, *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*, to a pair of computer linguistic experts, who found significant similarities among the books.

Mr. Brooks, too, noted *The Cuckoo's Calling* contained some Latin phrases, as the Harry Potter books do, and that it had scenes of drug taking, as *The Casual Vacancy* does.

Finally, Mr. Brooks said, he described “to go for it.” He directly asked in an e-mail to a Rowling spokeswoman, “I believe that Robert Galbraith is in fact J.K. Rowling, and will you please come back with a clear answer?” The response he received from the spokeswoman said that she had “decided to fess up.”

Mr. Rowling made a lot of money from this book, and so did the publishers, after the revelation. In just a few hours the book shot to No.1 on the Amazon best-seller lists in both Britain and the United States.

I was appreciating my family photos on my computer, admiring my two beautiful babies, when I found a disturbing trend: my laptop was almost all the pictures. There was my daughter, 8 months old, playing at my feet while I was typing away on the couch. There was me and my son, with the laptop at my side as I held him in my arms.

I’d heard about the Internet addiction before, but always assumed It was something limited to socially challenged guys who played too much World of Warcraft (a computer game). Now it seems my Internet “habit” is slowly but surely crossing the line. Sometimes I find myself up at midnight, surfing the Web while my family are sleeping. I read news, keep up with friends and write my blog...just for something to do.

It turns out that I’m not the only mama who is addicted to the computer. These moms are contributing to a growing global addiction. There is a movement among psychiatrists (doctors who specialize in mental diseases) to recognize the Internet addiction as an official mental disorder. And a recent Stanford University national survey days at a time; 9 percent try to hide their “unnecessary Internet use” from their loved ones; 8 percent admit they use the Web as a way to escape problems.

You’re likely not the kind of addict who doesn’t bathe and abuses drugs to help her stay “up” for more online time. You may have noticed, though, that going online has become a necessary part of your life, which, at last, means a load of cloths go unwashed.

It may also mean you’re missing much time with you baby-something you probably do care about.

In short, getting along with your boss requires getting to know his likes and dislikes and learning to work with his personality and management style.
