Cobh, a small coastal town in Co. Cork, is a historic, welcoming, creative, ever-changing city with extraordinary surprises to be discovered. It is probably best known for its Titanic connection. St Colman's Cathedral

The cathedral was built in the Neo-Gothic style and took 47 years to construct. Finally opened in 1911, it features a 100m high spire(尖顶) and a tower that houses 42 bells, making it the largest carillon(大钟琴) in Ireland. Whether it is a quick spin(兜风) up the hill in your car, or a hike on foot, you won't be disappointed when you get there.

The Titanic Experience

This tour is located in the original White Star Line Ticket Office in the centre of Cobh, the departure point for the final 123 passengers who boarded the Titanic on 11th April 1912. You can explore the official Titanic Experience website for anything related to the tour.

Spike Island

If you are interested in visiting old prisons, I'm sure you've heard of Kilmainham Gaol and the Cork City Gaol. Spike Island consists of 104 acres of isolated land in Cork Harbour. Visitors need to get on a boat to the Spike Island. More tour details, prices, etc. are available on the Spike Island website.

The Titanic Trail—a guided walking tour of the town of Cobh.

Fota House and Gardens—a beautiful garden setting featuring some rare and foreign plants.

A story of a man who made the ultimate journey of love, cycling from India to Sweden to see his sweetheart, has captured the hearts of thousands online.

The epic tale began in 1975 when wealthy 19-year-old Charlotte Von Schedvin who was a student in London at the time travelled to India in 1975 to meet the poor but well-known portrait artist Mahanandia. The Indian was born in 1949 into a weaver family in Odisha Dhenkanal and was thus considered an untouchable in the society.

Although his family couldn't afford his education, he managed to gain a place at the College of Art in New Delhi where word of his talent quickly spread.

In events that wouldn't be out of place in a romantic movie, when the young Charlotte Von Schedvin met the painter, the two fell in love with one another. He was greatly impressed by her beauty and she, with his pure simplicity. Despite their contrasting backgrounds, the pair soon married.

In 1978, the time came for Charlotte to return to her native country and she requested her husband join her back in Europe. However, Mahanandia was in the middle of his studies and said he would join her after these were completed. The couple stayed in touch through letters and despite Charlotte's offers to send flight tickets, Mahanandia was determined to meet her in his own way.

Selling his belongings, he managed to get enough money to buy a second-hand bike and set out on the brave journey to be reunited. From New Delhi the love-struck adventurer entered Afghanistan, Iran, Turkey, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Germany, Austria and Denmark. It wasn't an easy journey. His bike broke down numerous times along the way and he had to go on without food for days.

In total the trip took four months and three weeks before he finally reached Gothenburg, Sweden. Upon arrival, Charlotte's parents welcomed him with open arms and 40 years later, the pair are still happily married.

When you're sledding or skiing, the bright light of the sun bouncing off(反射) the snow can blind you. A good pair of sunglasses will help you enjoy your outdoor sporting activities to the fullest. Your parents might also want to wear sunglasses when they're driving if there's a lot of snow on the ground.

Sunglasses have been around a long time. It wasn't until the late 1920s, though, that inexpensive, mass-produced sunglasses were introduced to the United States by Sam Foster. Foster's sunglasses became popular on the beaches of Atlantic City, New Jersey, where he sold them under the name Foster Grant from a Woolworth store on the boardwalk.

Today, there are an amazing number of options when it comes to sunglasses. You can get cheap sunglasses at discount stores for a few dollars. On the other hand, you can also get sunglasses at specialty optical shops that cost hundreds of dollars.

What kind of sunglasses you need and how much they cost will depend upon the materials and technologies used. For example, the cheapest sunglasses use nothing more than color glass or plastic to help protect your eyes from bright sunlight. Depending upon the color used, the sunglasses will absorb certain types of light and reflect others. These cheapest sunglasses rarely offer the kind of protection your eyes really need.

More expensive sunglasses will likely have polarized lenses(偏光镜片). These special lenses help to block glare from light reflecting off of various horizontal surfaces, such as water or a highway. Polarized glasses only allow vertically polarized light

through, so glare from a lake, for example, will be blocked.

High-quality sunglasses will also usually feature protection from various types of ultraviolet radiation (紫外线辐射). These are the sun's harmful rays that can cause sunburn and many types of eye problems. Of course, high prices don't always mean the best protection. Instead of judging your sunglasses by their price tag, we should look at what percentage of UV rays they block.

If you're feeling a little down, don't reach for a glass of wine—grab your trowel (铲子) and head to the flowerbeds instead. A spot of gardening will lift your spirits, as a study suggests. More than 90 per cent of gardeners think it improves their mood, according to a survey for *Gardeners' World* magazine. It also found that gardeners are less likely to display signs associated with unhappiness or depression.

The survey of 1,500 adults in the UK found that 80 per cent of gardeners feel satisfied with their lives compared with 67 per cent of non-gardeners. *Gardeners' World* editor Lucy Hall said, "We have long suspected it, but our research means we can definitely say gardening makes you happy."

The most popular hobby in the UK is computing or gaming, with 52 per cent of respondents (调查对象) naming it as their favorite pastime. But gardening came joint second, along with walking or hiking, on 43 per cent. And overall, outdoor pursuits appear to bring the most happiness—78 per cent of walkers are satisfied with their lives, as are 75 per cent of those who fish, according to the survey. Keeping busy with any pastime, though, is important—for those with no hobbies, only 55 per cent were satisfied with their lives.

Professor of environment and society at the University of Essex, Jules Pretty, said,

“Scientific research at a number of universities, including at the University of Essex, now clearly shows that engagement with green places is good for personal health. We also know that short-term mental health improvements are protective of long-term health benefits.”

We thus conclude that there would be a large potential benefit to individuals, society and to the costs of the health service if all groups of people were to self-medicate (自我治疗) more with what we at Essex call green exercise. Gardening falls into this category—it is good for both mental and physical health, and all social and age groups benefit. It provides a dose of nature.
