CARDIFF, Wales Poets, singers and musicians from across the globe gathered in Wales to celebrate the tradition of storytelling.

"It might seem strange that people still want to listen in age of watching television, but this is an unusual art form whose time has come again," said David Ambrose, director of Beyond the Border, an international storytelling festival in Wales.

"Some of the tales, like those the Inuit from Canada, are thousands years old. So our storytellers have come from distant lands to connect us with the distance of time," he said early this month.

Two Inuit women, both in their mid 60s, are among the few remaining who can do Kntadjait, or throat singing, which has few words and much sound. Their art is governed by the cold of their surroundings, forcing them to say little but listen attentively.

Ambrose started the festival in 1993, after several years of working with those reviving (coming back into use or existence) storytelling in Wales.

"It came out of a group of people who wanted to reconnect with traditions, and as all the Welsh are storytellers, it was <u>in good hands</u> here." Ambrose said.

The bicycling craze came in when we were just about at the right age to enjoy it. At first even "safety" bicycle were too dangerous and improper for ladies to ride, and they had to have tricycles. My mother had (I believe) the first female tricycle in Cambridge: and I had a little one, and we used to go out for family rides, all together; my father in front on a bicycle, and my brother Charles standing on the bar behind my mother. I found it very hard work, going noisily away on my hard tyres; a glorious, but not a pleasurable pastime.

Then, one day at lunch, my father said he had just seen a new kind of tyre, filled up with air, and he thought it might be a success. And soon after that everyone had bicycles, ladies and all; and bicycling became the smart thing in society, and the lords and ladies had their pictures in the papers, riding along in the park, in straw boater hats.

My mother must have fallen off her bicycle pretty often, for I remember seeing, several times, the worst cuts on her legs. But she never complained, and always kept these mishaps to herself. However, the great Mrs. Phillips, our cook, always knew all about them; as indeed she knew practically everything that ever happened. She used to draw us into the servants' hall to tell us privately: "Her Ladyship had a bad fall yesterday; she cut both her knees. But don't let her know I told you." So we never dared say anything. Similar accidents used to occur when, at the age of nearly seventy, she insisted on learning to drive a car. She never mastered the art of reversing, and was in every way an unconventional and terrifying driver. Mrs. Phillips used then to tell us: "Her Ladyship ran into the back of a milk-cart yesterday; but it wasn't much hurt"; or "A policeman stopped her Ladyship because she was on the wrong side of the road; but he said she didn't know what the white line on the road meant, so he explained and let her go on." Mrs. Phillips must have had an excellent Intelligence Service under her control, for the stories were

Several hundred animal rights activists—some in their underwear, others topless—marched through the streets of Pamplona Tuesday to protest bullfrighting on the eve of the Spainsh city's wildly popular running of the bulls.

Holding banners reading Stop The Bloody Bullfrights, about 200 supporters of PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) came from 15 countries to march along the same cobblestone (鹅卵石) route that bulls and daredevil humans cover every July in a series of mad dashes from a holding pen to the bullring.

The protesters had planned to run totally nude (裸体的) but could not because they didn't get the necessary town hall permit, the Efe news agency reported. Police could not confirm the report.

Isabel Gonzalez, head of an anti-bullfrighting organization in Belgium, said bullfighting is cruel.

"The animals suffer, and nobody has the right to mistreat them just to stage a fiesta (节日),"she said.

She said the running of the bulls also is inhumane because runners pull the bull's tails, kick them and "the animals run in a state of panic."

The "Running of the Bulls", or "Encierro" as it is known in Spain, was born out of a

necessity to move the bulls from outside the town to the bullring. It is held at eight o'clock each morning from the 7 th to the 14 th of July inclusive. This year's festival begins Tuesday with a ceremony called the chupinazo, in which a small rocket is fired from a balcony overlooking the main square to signal the start of nine days of street parties in honor of the city's patron saint, San Fermin.

At some point though, his interest in medicine is turned into a desire to become rich. So Andrew struggles between his ideals and interest in money. Which one will win in the end? "The Citadel" has excellent character descriptions. Through Andrew's character and career, Cronin exposes some very unpleasant facts about the medical profession.

The characters and events make "The Citadel" a powerful novel. Anyone who believes in a

fair and just society would love it.

Eraser

If you like action, "Eraser" is the film to see. Arnold Schwarzenegger stars in this film and Charles Russell directs. Schwarzenegger plays the leading role as John Kruger, a police officer whose code name is Eraser. He protects government witnesses who are in danger, by erasing their old identity and giving them a new one. His task is to protect a beautiful woman, played by Vanessa Williams, who can uncover a scandal in which people in the government take part. Her enemies stop at nothing to keep her from making the truth known. But Eraser does everything to keep her alive. He alone must guard her from some of the most terrifying forces in the world before time runs out. But will he succeed?

This multi-million dollar production has some breathtaking scenes. The special effects and performances are very good. The film's only disadvantage is that it has a weak plot and the ending is not surprising, unlike other Schwarzenegger films.

All in all, this action-packed film will not be interesting to everyone. But action-lovers and those who enjoy special effects will enjoy it.
