A recent study, published in last week's Journal of the American Medical Association, offers a picture of how dangerous it is to get a lift from a teenage driver. Indeed, a 16-year-old driver with three or more passengers is three times as likely to have a serious accident as a teenager driving alone.

The author also found that the death rate for teenage drivers increased dramatically after 10 pm, and especially after midnight. With passengers in the car, the driver was even more likely to die in a late-night accident.

Robert Foss, a scientist at the University of North Carolina Highway Safety Research Center, says the higher death rates for teenage drivers have less to do with "really stupid behavior" than with just a lack of driving experience. "The basic problem," he says, "is that

adults who are responsible for giving out licenses fail to recognize how complex and skilled a task driving is."

Both he and the author of the study believe that the way to mitigate (使缓解) the problem is to have states set up so-called graduated licensing systems, in which getting a license is a process with several stages. A graduated license requires that a teenager first prove himself able to drive in the presence of an adult, followed by a period of driving with night of passenger restrictions (限制) before graduating to full driving rights.

Graduated licensing systems have reduced teenage driver crashes, according to recent studies.

Welcome, everybody, to the lovely house and gardens of Rosewood, once the home of the famous writer, Sebastian George. He bought the house in 1902 although he had first seen it two years earlier. At that time the owners let it out to a tenant(租户) because George was too slow making up his mind to buy it .When it came back on the market , there was no hesitation(犹豫) and he bought it immediately , for  $\pm 9,300$ , even though the house had no bathroom, no running water upstairs and no electricity .

When he came here, he'd been married for ten years .During that time, he'd become one of the most famous writers in the English-speaking world. His professional success was great, but his personal life wasn't as successful. He was no longer on speaking terms with his brother and had been devastated (压倒) by the death at the age of seven of his elder daughter, Josephine.

Moving to Rosewood allowed the family to start a new life. George regarded Rosewood as a pure example of a traditional country house of this part of England and did some of his most successful writing here. The house and its grounds became the family haven(避难所)and their escape to privacy and quiet .

One of the great advantages of growing houseplants is how good they make your home look.

D

"When I design a home, I put a houseplant in every room, because I don't think a room is complete without a live plant," said interior (室内) designer Barbara. "When you bring a living object into a room, you promote feelings of nature, life and vitality. The different shades of green also soften a space and give it a lived-in look."

Indoor plants make great decorator pieces, agreed interior designer Stacey. "Most furnishings and architectural details are made up of hard surfaces and straight lines, but houseplants add softness and depth to a space," she said.

With their wide variety of leaf shapes, sizes, colors and textures, houseplants can be used to decorate just about any interior, and they serve a wide variety of design purposes.

"Houseplants can be used to make a room look larger," said Stacey. If you want to make a ceiling appear higher, for instance, put a tall, thin plant in the corner of the room. To fill in dead corners, use a tall, bushy plant. If you don't have enough space for floor plants, try hanging houseplants.

You can also use houseplants to make large rooms look smaller. Accomplish this by bringing in a plant that is oversized for the space, which will make the ceiling feel lower, or choose a plant that grows up and then drapes (悬垂).

Plants can also be used to break up large living spaces and create transitions between rooms.

"If your home's design is such that you step right into your living room when you enter your house, you can make the entry less unpleasant with a line of houseplants," said Barbara.

Clusters (丛; 群) of small plants add a decorative touch to certain areas of the home such as on desks, pianos, fire-place mantels, nightstands and in bathrooms next to sinks or on bathtub decks. They can be placed in individual decorative pots or grouped together in a basket or larger pot.
